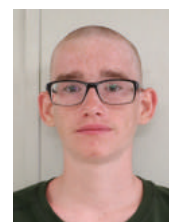

LEADERSHIP, BAND, AND FOOTBALL CAMP

The week before the cadets return to MMA, we hold three unique camps that cadets must be invited to in order to attend.

The first is the Leadership Orientation Course, which is conducted at the Marine Military Academy for the following Academic Year. The selected cadets have worked hard to get this far, but this is just the beginning of a journey that will be exciting, challenging and rewarding. The skills that these cadets accrue and put into practice will be of significant benefit to him long after he has graduated from the Academy. Each cadet is expected to come to the Leadership Orientation Course physically and mentally prepared. We have a strenuous, progressive physical training program during the course that will also be used as a means to create the physical and mental pressure that is part of the overall leadership evaluation process. This same physical training program will continue during the academic year.

The second camp is Band Camp. Band Camp is a great opportunity for the MMA Band to get ahead of the year. This year we had 14 participants, some also participated in the Leadership and Football Camps concurrently. The cadets spent their time practicing with their daily warmups as well as marching techniques, methods & technical exercises, ceremonial and marching selections and pep songs. The week was also filled with Life Skills courses and an Anti-Bullying course. The cadets ended their camp with a promotion ceremony and a field trip to a local Jump Zone center.

Lastly, we have Football Camp. Many of the Leatherneck players attend a very intense week of training with the football staff at MMA. The cadets spend their time lifting weights, practicing plays and watching film of their upcoming opponents previous games. The staff does their best to lay out a plan for which positions each cadet will fill based on their talents. Again, many of the players are also involved in either the Leadership or Band Camp as well so they definitely stay busy the entire week. The MMA Leatherneck Football Camp is a wonderful way to get a jump start on the upcoming football season!



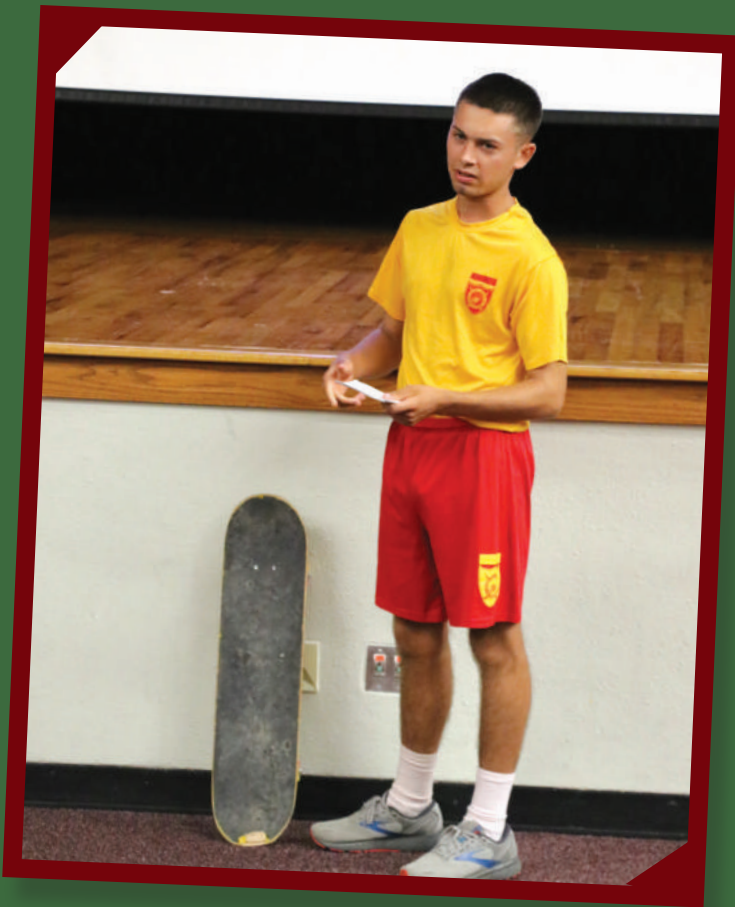

COLLEGE PREPARATION

When does College preparation begin?

Preparation begins when a cadet starts school. This is a highly individualized process, and I must make sure the cadets keep their options open until it comes time to narrow down their choice of schools.

What does the College office placement do?

My goal as the College Counselor is to help cadets find the right college for them. I assist cadets search for college, check admission criteria/requirements, prepare them for interviews, read and edit their essays as well as review their entire application. I also assist in helping cadets register for any upcoming SAT/ACT exams and provide them with prep material for these college entrance exams. I provide any support possible to help assist in their future endeavors. That's what I'm here for, and I'm eager to help! I also help cadets with their research in college scholarships and financial aid. I arrange many college representative visits to our campus to speak to our cadets about their university or military branch.

What is currently happening in the College Room?

I am assisting cadets with their registration for the upcoming SAT and ACT exam as well as guiding cadets during the college application process. Many of my seniors have created their account with Parchment, our electronic service system used to send official transcripts to colleges and are well underway on their apps.

An NRTOC scholarship workshop was held on Saturday, August the 20th, for those interested in applying for the NRTOC scholarship. I had 1st Lt. Shoenfeld here from the San Antonio recruiting station, to assist those in the process. (he will return later this fall to help assist)

Many college representatives have reached out to me and are eager to set up an information session to speak to our cadets about their university.

PSAT/NMSQT test materials are being ordered, all cadets (except seniors) will be taking the PSAT on October 25th. They will be receiving prep material and a discussion from me about the importance of this "practice" SAT test, how it will benefit them and prepare them for the actual SAT.

An ASVAB test is in the works of being scheduled towards the end of this month or early October.

I will be attending many college updates to keep me informed on the latest developments and requirements for college admission.

As the AP coordinator, I am helping assist our AP teachers in getting their AP class signed up for the AP exam taking place in May. Some have brought their class down to the college room to help assist with joining the AP classroom through CollegeBoard. (AP contracts will be sent out to parents soon via email, keep an eye out for it).

At what age should a cadet apply to college?

A cadet can begin applying for college as early as the summer of their senior year, depending on when the college application opens.

What do colleges look for on a college application?

All colleges and universities evaluate the same criteria, such as GPA, class rank, SAT and/or ACT scores, leadership ability, extracurricular activities, college essay and community service hours.

Does the admission application for a service academy differ from that of a college? If so, how?

Yes. Applying to a United States service academy is different than a college:

The application is available the spring semester of their junior year instead of the summer/fall semester of their senior year.

A cadet is required to apply for a nomination from his congressman and/or senator as well as the vice president.

A cadet must pass a physical fitness test.

If accepted, the tuition for the cadet is covered by the US military. After graduation, a cadet is an officer in the military and must serve a determined length of time on active duty. The United States Coast Guard Academy does not require a nomination. Applying to any of the service academies is extremely competitive.
