

Designed for boys ages 11 to 18, the four-week program promises a transformative experience grounded in discipline, leadership, and physical endurance.

From the moment campers arrive, the tone is set. Campers and families meet their drill instructors and camp instructors, give one last hug and say good-bye. Haircuts are issued, uniforms are donned, and days quickly take on a military-style rhythm filled with structure and intensity.

CAMPERS WORK HARD,

CAMPERS MEET CHALLENGES STRAIGHT IN THE FACE;

MMA welcomed over 300 young men from across the country—and around the globe—as its highly anticipated summer camp kicked off in July. Designed for boys ages 11 to 18, the four-week program is a transformative process grounded in discipline, leadership, and physical endurance. The program is operated by retired U.S. Marines and seasoned athletic coaches, many of whom bring decades of experience in mentoring and leadership development.



















Each day begins early with physical training and is filled with a variety of activities that test both body and mind. Campers participate in different challenges, including rappelling, obstacle courses, rifle range practice, team sports, paintball, and leadership exercises.

In addition to core programming, the academy also offers specialized flight training for aspiring aviators.

The campers learn a variety of life skills and overcome some of their own individual fears, break their own barriers and raise their own bars. In addition, they learn how to work with one another, leadership, team work and the value your work brings to a group setting.





From the high ropes challenge course to high ropes, rifle range and skeet shooting, these campers experienced challenges like never before. Campers learn some amazing skills they will take with them for many of life's challenges. Camp activities are built to create strong young men - both mentally and physically!

FALL REGISTRATION WELCOMES NEW FAMILIES


WELCOMING NEW YOUNG MEN AND THEIR FAMILIES TO THE 2025-26 SCHOOL YEAR.

We look forward to seeing these fresh new faces join our battalion!




